This Actuarial Certificate is prepared for Peters Family Superannuation Fund for the financial year ending 30 June 2022. It complies with The Institute of Actuaries of Australia Professional Standard 406.

Information I have relied upon

This Actuarial Certificate relies upon information provided to us by Goodall & Co on behalf of the Trustees of Peters Family Superannuation Fund. The key information I have relied upon is shown in Appendix 1.

You have stated that:

- ◆ Any assets segregated by election (using separate asset pools) have been removed from the data entered.
- ◆ The Fund has met the Minimum Pension Standards. That is, the required minimum amount has been withdrawn from the pension during the financial year.
- ◆ The types of pensions in the Fund include Allocated Pensions, Market-linked pensions, Term allocated pensions and Account based pensions. They do not include Defined Benefits pensions.
- ◆ The pensions valued meet the requirements to be considered Retirement Superannuation Income Streams under the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

My calculations have been based on draft financial statements. If any information provided, as shown in Appendix 1, changes materially then you should revise that information and obtain an updated Actuarial Certificate. If you don't have login details then you can contact Lime Actuarial to obtain your login details. There is no charge for updating your Actuarial Certificate.

Description of Member Cash Transaction Types

Transaction Type	Includes
Concessional Contribution	One off and regular Concessional contributions
Non-Concessional Contribution	Non-Concessional Contributions
Transfer In	Transfers from outside the fund into accumulation accounts including Rollovers In and Insurance claims received.
Non Retirement Withdrawal	One off and regular amounts paid out of the fund from TTR accounts where the member has not met a condition of release and from accumulation accounts. Includes lump sum benefits, death benefits, rollovers out, insurance premiums, and pension drawdowns from TTR accounts where the member has not met a condition of release.
Retirement Withdrawal	One off and regular amounts paid out of the fund from TTR accounts where the member has met a condition of release and from Account Based Pension accounts. Includes pension drawdowns, lump sum benefits, death benefits, rollovers out, insurance premiums.

Description of Non-Cash Transaction Types

Transaction Type	Includes
Account Based Pension Commencements	Account Based Pensions commenced during the financial year. Do not include pensions commenced in previous years, these are shown as opening balances. Do not include TTR Pensions. An Account Based Pension commencement involves transferring member balances from Accumulation to Account Based Pension.
Retirement Pension Commutation	Retirement Pensions ceased either in part or in entirety, where balances are transferred from Retirement (TTR pension where a condition of release has been met, and Account Based Pension) to Accumulation.
Retirement Pension Reversion	Transfers of a retirement pension balance from a deceased member to a surviving spouse.
Conversions from TTR to Retirement Pension	Conversion of a TTR to a Retirement Pension when a member meets a condition of release.
Contribution Split	Contributions which are split from one spouse to another. The amount split will be up to 85% of the original concessional contribution. Note that the original concessional contribution will also be shown on this form if it took place in the same year.
Transfers from Reserves to Non Retirement	Transfer from reserve account to a member Accumulation account or TTR pension.
Transfers from Reserves to Retirement	Transfer from reserve account to a member TTR pension where a condition of release has been met or Account Based Pension.

APPENDIX 3: ASSUMPTIONS

I have assumed that all transactions occur before investment income is earned each day

No assumptions are required to calculate the rate of increase in pension liability and earning rate as by definition, the value of assets and liabilities of account based income streams must be equal.
