Consumer Price Index (State)

Statistical releases relating to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) which measures quarterly changes in the price of a 'basket' of goods and services which account for a high proportion of expenditure by the CPI population group (i.e. metropolitan households). As well as covering a wide range of goods and services the CPI measures price movements in each of the capital cities in Australia. The CPI provides the official measure of inflation in Australia.

Brisbane's headline CPI increased 1.1% in December quarter 2020, resulting in a 1.0% increase over the year.
